



Kids Church Behavior Expectations

Our Vision

FCW's (Foundations Church Williamsburg) Kids Church ministry offers a nurturing and inclusive environment where all children experience God's love. To make this vision a reality, Kids Church teachers, FCW Leadership and parents/guardians will work together to build a positive and respectful environment. FCW is extremely grateful for the excellent and valued volunteers who give of their limited time to teach our children each Sunday. During Kids Church, your child will be given the opportunity to play, sing, listen to a Bible story, memorize Scripture and learn about God in ways that they'll understand. Your children will have loads of fun all while focusing on our six foundational truths: God made everything, God loves us, God is in charge of everything, God is good, Jesus came to save sinners and God wants to talk with us. If you believe the teachers should know specific information about your child, please share that information with the Kids Church Director. The information will be very valuable in helping create an environment that is beneficial for everyone. FCW is thankful for the cooperation of parents/guardians in partnering with us and the Kids Church teachers to work toward our vision.

Behavior Expectations

To make the classroom a beneficial learning environment for our children, Kids Church teachers expect certain behavior from students. Kids Church teachers and students are expected to work toward a goal of mutual respect.

The Behavior Expectations for Kids Church are:

- Be on time (Kids Church begins at 8:30am or 10:30am).
- Be ready to have fun and learn about God.
- Participate in classroom activities.
- Follow the teacher's instructions.
- Show respect to others in the classroom.
- Keep hands to self.
- Speak in turn and listen when others speak.
- Take care of the classroom (use materials wisely and help cleanup).

Corrective Action Plan

If a student does not meet the behavior expectations, the teacher will inform the student that his/her behavior does not meet expectations and will inform the student of the expected behavior. The student will be given an opportunity to correct their behavior using a 1, 2, 3 method: 1 = grace, 2 = a warning, and 3 = student is removed from the activity, all disruptions will be documented and the parent will be requested from service. When a child's disruptive behavior requires a child to be removed from a classroom three times, parents must accompany the child for at least two classes upon return. This process will require a parent to complete and clear a background check and then accompany the child to Kids Church for two consecutive Sundays before the child is permitted to return to Kids Church without parent supervision.
